

# Street Tree Information

## WA Weeping Peppermint

A common street tree throughout Perth, the WA Peppermint tree is drought tolerant, suitable for a variety of soils and provides dense shade. This species is a low allergen tree as recommended by the Asthma foundation.

### Botanical Name

*Agonis flexuosa*

### Origin

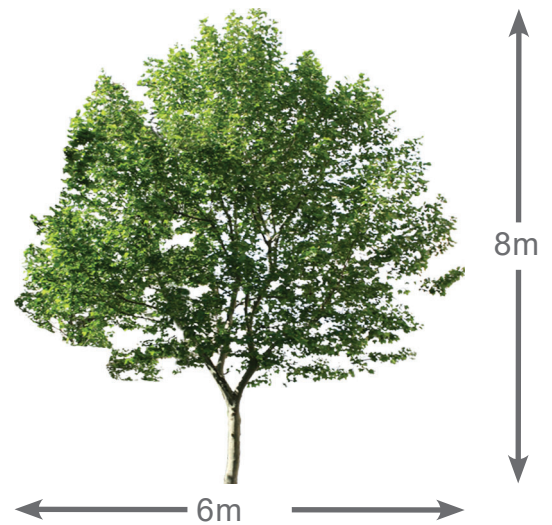
South Western Australia

### Foliage

Weeping soft green leaves cover the tree, providing excellent shade.

### Flowers

Insignificant white flowers in spring.



- Medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 4m wide

## Callistemon Kings Park Special

**Callistemon Kings Park Special** is a common street tree throughout Perth, which grows into a compact small tree. It is drought tolerant and suits a range of soil types.

### Botanical Name

Callistemon Kings Park Special

### Origin

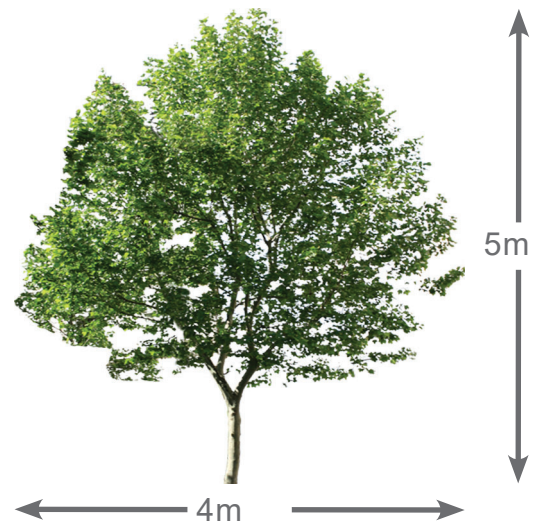
A cultivated variety developed at King's Park Botanic Garden from an unknown seed source.

### Foliage

A bushy tree with dark green leaves which cover the tree all year round, providing excellent shade.

### Flowers

Masses of red bottlebrush flowers in spring and summer which attract native birds.



- Small sized tree
- Evergreen
- Suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## Red Flowering Gum

A hardy and drought tolerant species with spectacular red flowers.

### Botanical Name

*Corymbia ficifolia*

### Origin

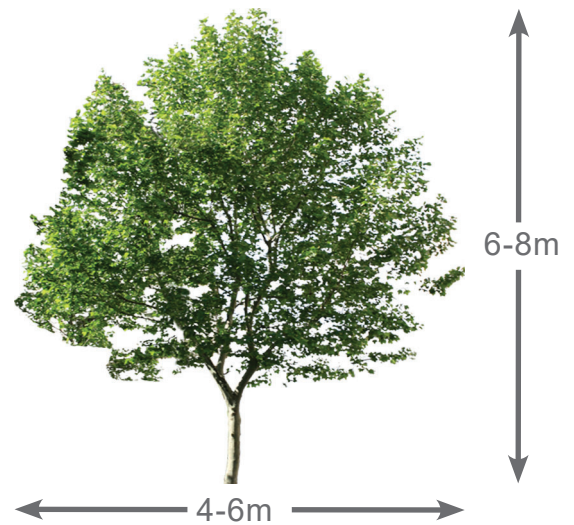
South West Australia

### Foliage

Compact growth habit with dark green leaves

### Flowers

Masses of red bird attracting flowers in summer. Cultivars also come in various flowering colours, ranging from pinks and reds through to orange.



- Small sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 4m wide





# Street Tree Information

## Tuckeroo

A hardy species which grows into a neat, compact rounded form.

### Botanical Name

*Cupaniopsis anacardioides*

### Origin

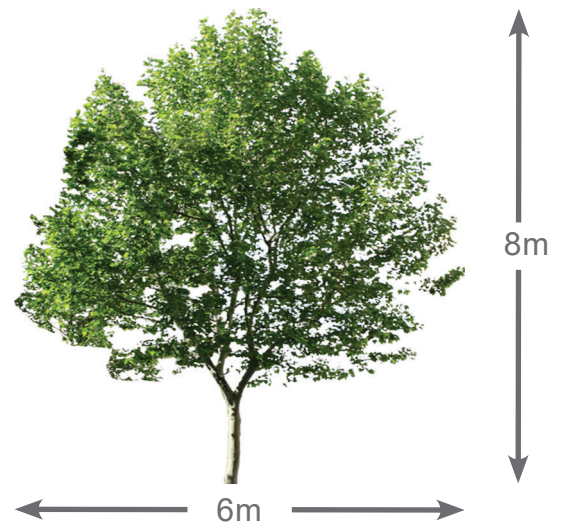
Coastal rainforests in eastern and northern Australia, as well as New Guinea.

### Foliage

Attractive large, deep green glossy leaves, growing to a neat rounded canopy. Excellent shade provision.

### Flowers

Inconspicuous greenish yellow flowers in spring, followed by small yellow fruit in summer.



- Medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## White Iron Bark

A drought tolerant, attractive small to medium eucalypt with an open canopy.

### Botanical Name

*Eucalyptus leucoxylon* ssp. *megolacarpa*

### Origin

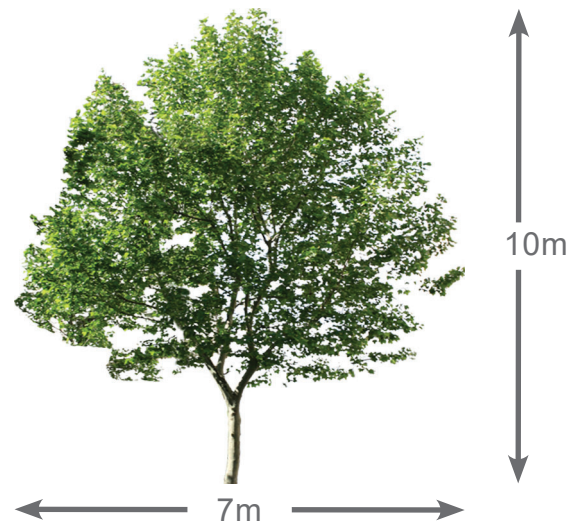
South and Eastern Australia

### Foliage

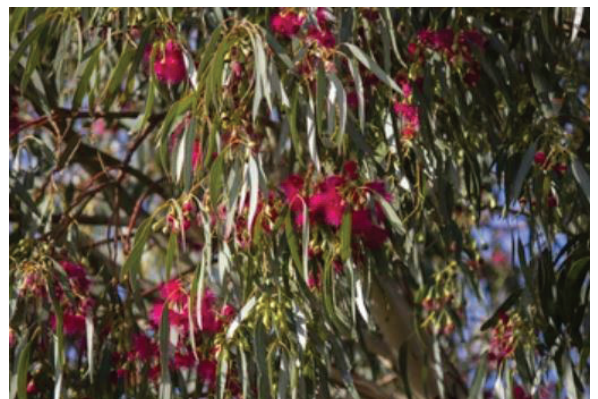
Grey-green long leaves with cream to grey coloured attractive bark.

### Flowers

Profuse display of pink or red flowers from late autumn through to spring. Flowers are bird attracting.



- Medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 4m wide

## Swamp Mallet

An attractive eucalypt with fine grey-green, soft foliage and distinctive smooth, pale brown bark. The tree has a slight weeping form and provides excellent shade.

### Botanical Name

*Eucalyptus spathulata*

### Origin

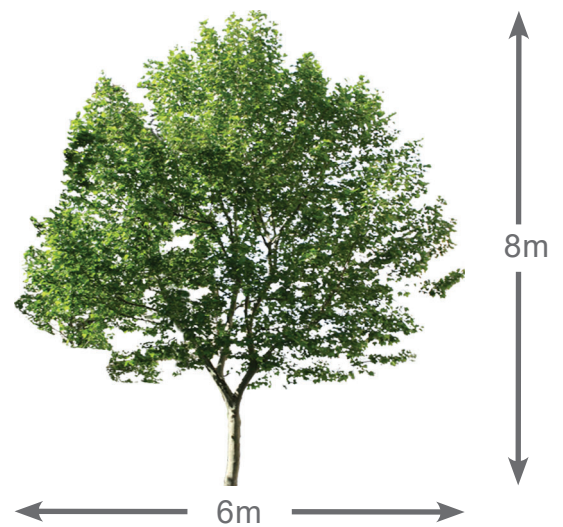
West Australia

### Foliage

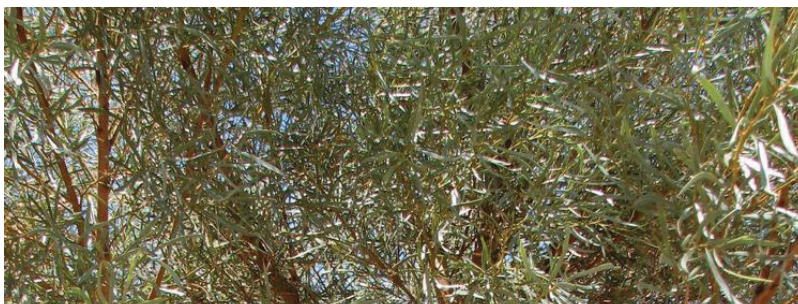
Olive green coloured long thin leaves.

### Flowers

White flowers in late summer and autumn which attract native birds.



- Small to medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## Coral Gum or Coolgardie Gum

An attractive small growing eucalypt, with salmon coloured flowers. This species tolerates drought and poor soils.

### Botanical Name

*Eucalyptus torquata*

### Origin

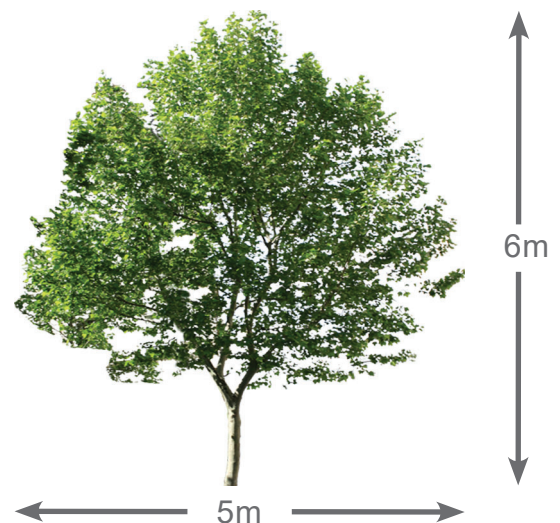
Inland areas of South Western Australia

### Foliage

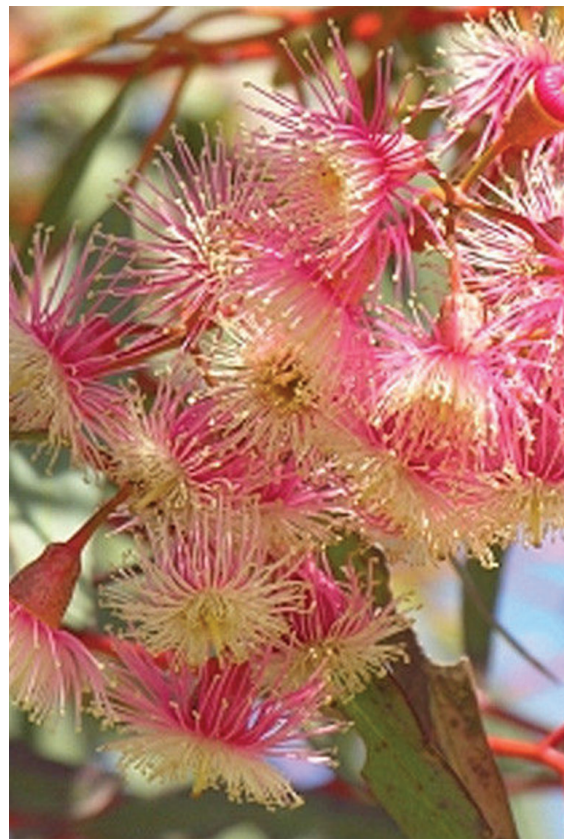
Evergreen silver - green foliage.

### Flowers

Spectacular bird attracting coral and/or pink-cream flowers open from spring to summer.



- Small sized tree
- Evergreen
- Suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## Little Ghost Gum

A small growing dwarf variety of Eucalyptus, with an attractive white trunk and weeping form.

### Botanical Name

*Eucalyptus victrix*

### Origin

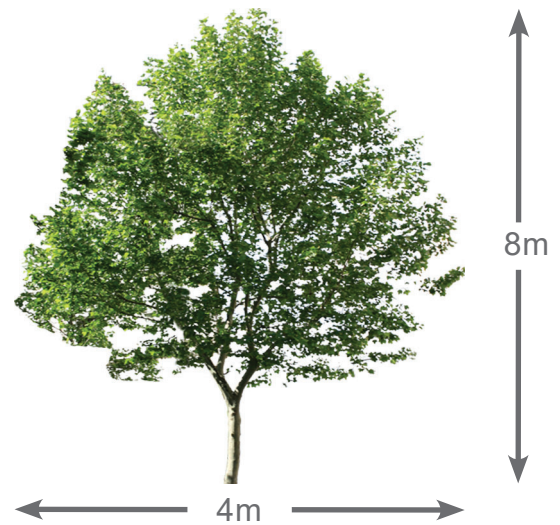
Inland Western Australia

### Foliage

Open form with pendulous green foliage and distinctive smooth white bark.

### Flowers

Small creamy-white flowers in Spring and Summer.



- Small to medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## Jacaranda

An attractive feature tree well known for its magnificent display of purple flowers.

### Botanical Name

*Jacaranda mimosifolia*

### Origin

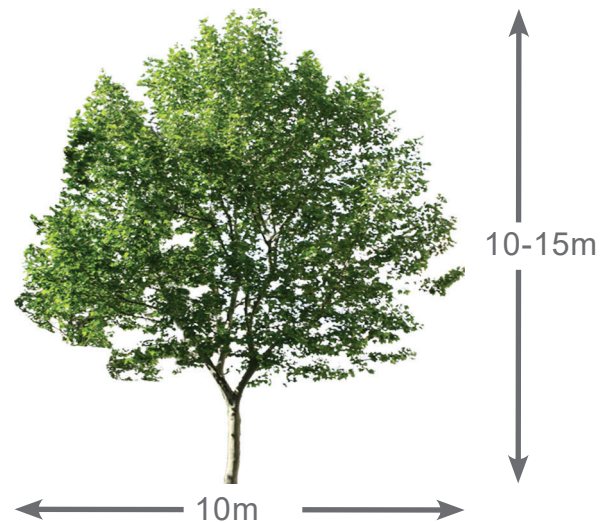
Central and South America

### Foliage

Delicate, fern like soft green leaves cover the tree in summer, providing excellent shade.

### Flowers

Magnificent display of purple flowers in late spring.



- Large sized tree
- Semi-deciduous
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 6m wide





# Street Tree Information

## Crepe Myrtle

Highly ornamental small tree with a striking display of flowers and interesting bark.

### Botanical Name

*Lagerstroemia indica*

### Origin

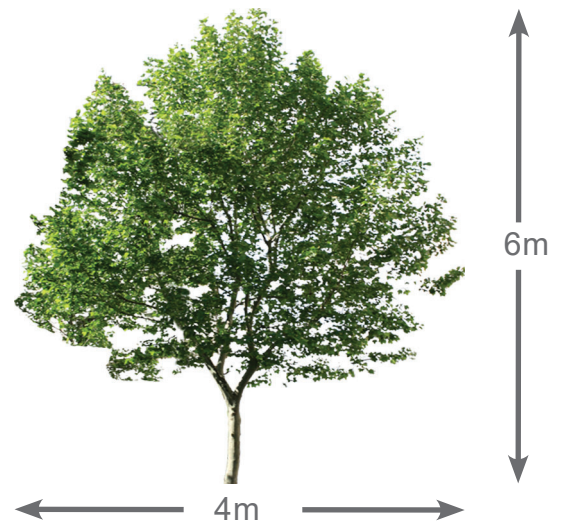
Asia

### Foliage

An upright tree, often multi-stemmed. Glossy dark green leaves change to red and bronze colours in autumn. Bark sheds revealing an attractive mottled trunk with pink, brown and cream tones.

### Flowers

An attractive feature tree known for its magnificent display of large white or pink flowers in summer.



- Small sized tree
- Deciduous
- Suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m

## Liquidambar

An attractive ornamental tree, known for its colourful autumn foliage display and upright pyramidal form.

### Botanical Name

*Liquidambar styraciflua* 'Rotundiloba'

### Origin

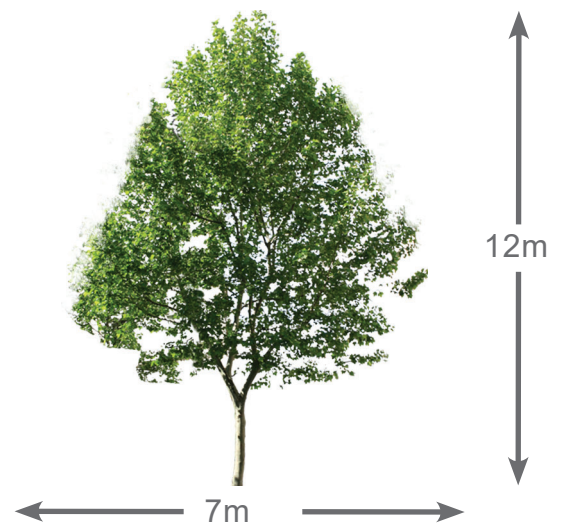
Americas

### Foliage

Maple-like foliage which is light green in colour, turning red, orange and yellow in autumn.

### Flowers

Insignificant flower display



- Medium to large sized tree
- Deciduous
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 4m wide

## Weeping Paperbark

An attractive tree with weeping foliage and contrasting white bark. This tree tolerates many soil types and can produce flowers all depending on conditions.

### Botanical Name

*Melaleuca leucadendra*

### Origin

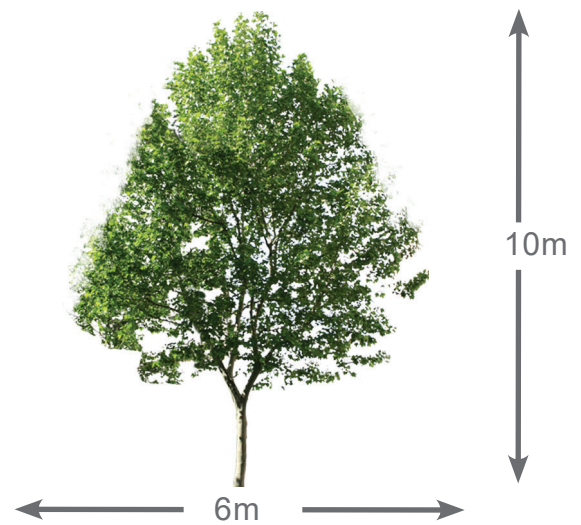
Northern Australia, New Guinea, Torres Strait

### Foliage

Long green thin leaves which appear in a soft weeping habitat, with white colored bark.

### Flowers

Bird attracting clusters of cream flowers appear throughout the year.



- Medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 4m wide





# Street Tree Information

## Broad Leaf Paperbark

Small growing Melaleuca with attractive white bark and striking red flowers. This species tolerates both dry and wet conditions.

### Botanical Name

*Melaleuca viridiflora*

### Origin

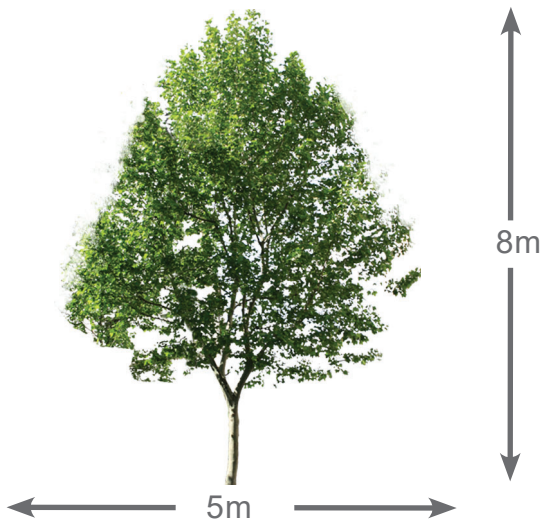
Northern Australia, New Guinea

### Foliage

Long dark green leaves, with with white colored papery bark.

### Flowers

Bird attracting red bottlebrush flowers appear during the summer months.



- Small to medium sized tree
- Evergreen
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## Manchurian Pear

An attractive ornamental tree known for its rounded form and colourful autumn foliage as well as masses of white flowers in spring.

### Botanical Name

*Pyrus ussuriensis*

### Origin

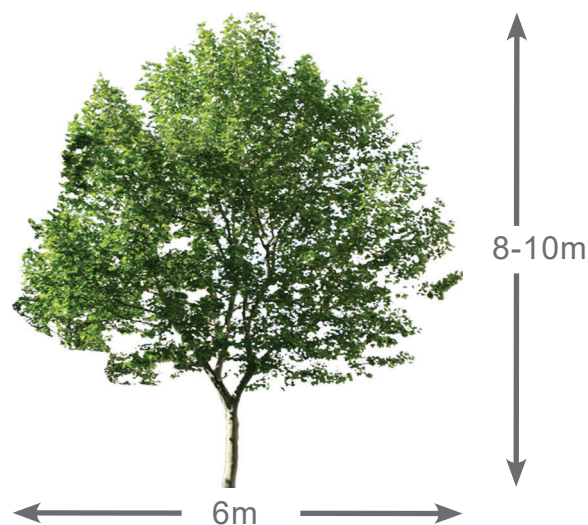
Asia

### Foliage

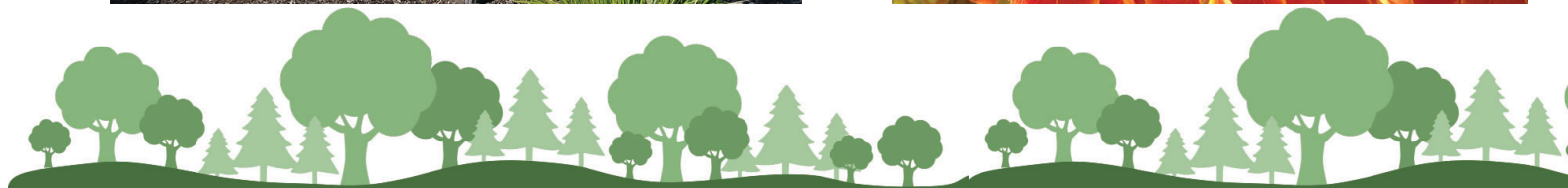
Glossy, dark green rounded leaves which turn red, orange, burgundy and yellow in autumn.

### Flowers

Prolific display of white flowers in early spring, followed by new green foliage.



- Medium sized tree
- Deciduous
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 4m wide

## Snow Pear

An attractive ornamental tree known for its colourful autumn foliage as well as masses of white flowers in spring.

### Botanical Name

*Pyrus nivalis*

### Origin

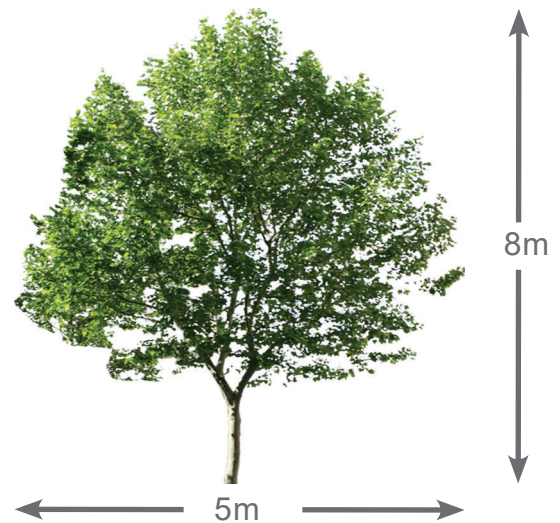
Asia

### Foliage

Delicate leaves with silver tones differentiate this pear from standard varieties. Leaves turn orange and yellow in autumn.

### Flowers

Prolific display of white flowers in early spring, followed by new silver toned foliage.



- Medium sized tree
- Deciduous
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide

## Chinese Tallow



An attractive ornamental tree, known for its colourful autumn foliage display and upright compact form.

### Botanical Name

*Triadica sebifera*

### Origin

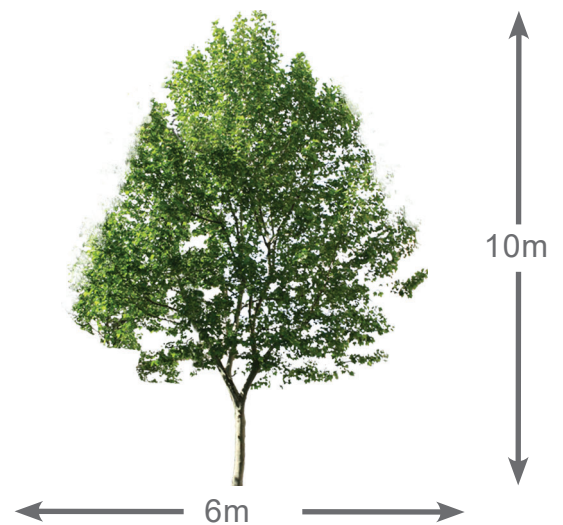
Asia

### Foliage

Heart shaped leaves which turn shades of red, orange and yellow in autumn.

### Flowers

Clusters of yellow Insignificant flowers.



- Small to medium sized tree
- Deciduous
- Not suitable under powerlines
- Suitable for verges over 3m wide
