## **5 RECEIVING OF THE ANNUAL REPORT**

### **5.1 THE MAYOR'S REPORT**

I am proud to present the second annual report as Mayor and we are excited to now move forward with key community projects made possible by Federal and State funding opportunities secured by the City.

These projects reflect the City of Kwinana's strong long-term investment in community infrastructure, including the redevelopment of the Kwinana Recquatic Centre and City Centre precinct, and staged improvements to the Kwinana Loop Trail. The City had already committed \$21.9 million in its Long-Term Financial Plan to progress the Recquatic redevelopment; with the addition of \$17.1 million in grant funding through the Australian Government's Thriving Suburbs Program, the project can now be fast-tracked to a total value of \$36.9 million.

The City has also secured funding to deliver key stages of the Kwinana Loop Trail, with \$3.5 million in State Government funding for Stage 1 and a further \$2.5 million Federal commitment announced by re-elected Member for Brand Madeleine King for Stage 2 of the upgrades.

While these opportunities will enhance our offering to the community, we are also presented with the challenge of now working towards delivering those projects in a timely fashion. I want to thank the Councillors for their commitment to the development and transformation of our community, it has been an honour to serve Kwinana with you for the past two years.

## **5.2 THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT**

This financial year marked a series of significant milestones for the City of Kwinana, reflecting both strong organisational performance and meaningful outcomes for our community. The City achieved a clean audit, with the Auditor noting the high standard of financial management and governance across the organisation. We also delivered a financial surplus, providing a solid foundation to progress priorities and invest confidently in Kwinana's future.

In parallel, the City delivered and commenced major projects at scale, with over \$20 million in capital works delivered during the year and several significant projects kicked off to support long-term community growth. These achievements sit alongside important governance milestones, including the elevation of the Boola Maara (Many Hands) Aboriginal Consultative Committee, believed to be the only committee of its kind currently operating in Western Australia.

Key infrastructure improvements continued, with the opening of the second stage of the Gilmore Avenue Shared Path, improving connectivity across Kwinana. We maintained a strong focus on community safety and environmental stewardship, while bringing people together through major events such as the new-look OMG! Festival held across multiple sites and nights, a thriving Alcoa Children's Festival, and the City's much-loved Lolly Run, which celebrated its 70th year.

The Koorliny Arts Centre delivered a bumper program and received multiple awards following the City assuming operations in July 2023. We also launched the Arclight initiative pilot in 2024, supporting at-risk young people to stay in school and out of the justice system—delivering tangible improvements to community safety while positively transforming young lives.

These achievements reflect the dedication, professionalism and commitment of our staff. I am proud to share these outcomes with the community through this annual report and thank all staff for their contribution to another successful year for the City of Kwinana.

### **6.2 MOTIONS BY ELECTORS**

Regulation 17 of the Local Government (*Administration*) Regulations 1996

#### *17. Voting at meeting (Act s. 5.31)*

- (1) Each elector who is present at a general or special meeting of electors is entitled to one vote on each matter to be decided at the meeting but does not have to vote.*
- (2) All decisions at a general or special meeting of electors are to be made by a simple majority of votes.*
- (3) Voting at a general or special meeting of electors is to be conducted so that no voter's vote is secret.*
