

We say the library.




You may have a disability.



You may be older.




You may find it hard to go places.

You may need an accessible parking bay.




Like when you can **not** walk.

Like when


• we run a program in the library

• there is an event next door






• our gates make sound.

You can use the accessible toilet in our building.


It has an adult changing place in it.
