	Priority	Initiatives/Actions to address concern
Careless and / or Dangerous Driving	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Free child seat restraint checks • Active Travel initiatives e.g. ride to school days • Deploy traffic counters to monitor vehicle speeds in response to complaints on specific sections of local roads • Share traffic data with WA Police for enforcement purposes at locations as requested • Assess and prune roadside vegetation where it restricts sight distance and contributes to road safety concerns, typically in response to customer requests (City Operations) • Investigate potential for improvements to Johnson Road pedestrian crossing at Ascot Parkway • Implement the Low-Cost Urban Road Safety Program at Southwest Bertram (Parkfield Boulevard, Champion Drive, Moombaki Avenue and Price Parkway etc.). Design to commence this year with construction planned for February 2027. • Retain the speed radar on Johnson Road and consider new locations • Ongoing infrastructure maintenance (footpath repairs, bollards)
Home Burglary	2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) • CCTV Subsidy • Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours
Hoon Driving	3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police • Community reporting allows the City to target hotspots and direct the traffic team to investigate using traffic counters to collect data • Strategic Planning with Main Roads • Regular community catch up opportunities with local police to hear community concerns • \$197,000 grant awarded to the City to secure MORVA, (Medina Off Road Vehicle Area) including a single entry point via Thomas Road and installation of CCTV towers to monitor the area
Property Damage	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCTV Subsidy • Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours • Street by Street – a neighbourhood engagement initiative that brings residents together to educate and strengthen local connections, build community pride and encourage reporting to Police • CPTED Approach – Street lighting across the City has been improved to improve visibility of the streets. 648 out of 716 lights have been updated – 91% • CPTED Audits on MUD (Multi-unit Dwellings) • Mobile CCTV Trailers to hotspot locations

Graffiti	7	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Education on reporting to Goodbye Graffiti and the City for rapid removal to support CPTED principles to discourage repeated graffiti • Opportunities for community to be involved in art murals across the City which help create a sense of ownership and pride • CCTV Subsidy • Mobile CCTV Trailers to hotspot locations
Stealing from dwelling (parcels, plants etc)	8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCTV Subsidy • Parcel Letterbox Subsidy • Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours

Disorderly Behaviour	10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trial Kickboxing / Self Defence Classes across the community • Activation of open spaces across the City through a number of avenues, including Healthy Lifestyle classes, as well as providing grants and funding for community events such as Neighbour Day • Walking groups are available to reduce individual feelings of safety. EOI available to start one in your area • Currently investigating communities understanding and experience of disorderly behaviour to possibly provide new initiatives to support community • Carry out an awareness campaign for community on reporting to Police

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
