Careless and / or Dangerous Driving	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Active Travel initiatives e.g. ride to school days Continue to deploy speed radar on Gilmore Avenue and consider new locations Deploy traffic counters to monitor vehicle speeds in response to complaints on specific sections of local roads Share traffic data with WA Police for locations requested by the community to support enforcement. Assess and prune roadside vegetation where it restricts sight distance and contributes to road safety concerns, typically in response to customer requests (City Operations) Ongoing infrastructure maintenance (footpath repairs, bollards) Police deploying distracted driver and seatbelt detection cameras along Gilmore Avenue
