| Careless and / or Dangerous Driving                    | 1        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Deploy traffic counters to monitor vehicle speeds in response to complaints on specific sections of local roads</li> <li>• Assess and prune roadside vegetation where it restricts sight distance and contributes to road safety concerns, typically in response to customer requests (City Operations)</li> <li>• Share traffic data with WA Police for locations requested by the community to support enforcement</li> <li>• Install new footpath and raised safety platform (speed bump) on Westcott Road near Medina Primary School</li> <li>• Road modifications to Pace Road to enhance safety in Medina Town Centre</li> <li>• Safe towing workshops in Medina Hall</li> <li>• Ongoing infrastructure maintenance (footpath repairs, bollards)</li> </ul> |
| Disorderly Behaviour                                   | 2        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trial Kickboxing / Self Defence Classes across the community</li> <li>• Activation of open spaces across the City through a number of avenues, including Healthy Lifestyle classes, as well as providing grants and funding for community events such as Neighbour Day</li> <li>• Walking groups are available to reduce individual feelings of safety. EOI available to start one in your area</li> <li>• Currently investigating communities understanding and experience of disorderly behaviour to possibly provide new initiatives to support community</li> <li>• Carry out an awareness campaign for community on reporting to Police</li> </ul>   |
| Hoon Driving   | 3        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police</li> <li>• Community reporting allows the City to target hotspots and direct the traffic team to investigate using traffic counters to collect data</li> <li>• Strategic Planning with Main Roads</li> <li>• Regular community catch up opportunities with local police to hear community concerns</li> <li>• \$197,000 grant awarded to the City to secure MORVA, (Medina Off Road Vehicle Area) including a single entry point via Thomas Road and installation of CCTV towers to monitor the area</li> </ul>   |
| Family Violence  | 4        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Community Services Working Group</li> <li>• Training City staff to understand the complexities and advocate for resources and support community</li> </ul>  |
| Assault  | 5        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Investigating personal safety devices</li> <li>• CPTED Approach – Street lighting across the City has been improved to improve visibility of streets. 213 out of 227 lights have been updated – 94%</li> <li>• Walking groups are available to reduce individual feelings of safety. EOI available to start one in your area</li> <li>• Campaign on reporting to police – crime stoppers / eyes on the street</li> <li>• Public CCTV</li> <li>• The Zone is a safe space (Town Centre)</li> <li>• Trial Kickboxing / Self Defence Classes across the community</li> </ul>   |
| Drug Dealing   | 6        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police</li> <li>• CPTED Approach – Street lighting across the City has been improved to improve visibility of the streets. 213 out of 227 lights have been updated – 94%</li> <li>• Street by Street – a neighbourhood engagement initiative that brings residents together to educate and strengthen local connections, build community pride and encourage reporting to Police</li> <li>• Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours</li> <li>• Mobile CCTV Trailers to hotspot locations</li> </ul>  |
| Drink / Drug Driving                                   | 7        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police</li> </ul>  |
| Home Burglary  | 8        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition)</li> <li>• CCTV Subsidy</li> <li>• Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours</li> </ul>   |
| Stealing from motor vehicle (number plate, laptop etc) | 9        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If you love it, Don't leave it Campaign</li> <li>• Secure PL8</li> <li>• CCTV Subsidy</li> </ul>  |
| Graffiti   | 10       | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Education on reporting to Goodbye Graffiti and the City for rapid removal to support CPTED principles to discourage repeated graffiti</li> <li>• Opportunities for community to be involved in art murals across the City which help create a sense of ownership and pride</li> <li>• CCTV Subsidy</li> <li>• Mobile CCTV Trailers to hotspot locations</li> </ul>  |
