	Priority	Initiatives/Actions to address concern
Careless and / or Dangerous Driving	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Footpaths were installed on Newstead Crescent and Woodley Way • Deploy traffic counters to monitor vehicle speeds in response to complaints on specific sections of local roads • Share traffic data with WA Police for locations requested by the community to support enforcement • Assess and prune roadside vegetation where it restricts sight distance and contributes to road safety concerns, typically in response to customer requests (City Operations) • Install footpath on Challenger Avenue between Bertram Road and Warner Road • Ongoing infrastructure maintenance (footpath repairs, bollards)
Disorderly Behaviour	2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trial Kickboxing / Self Defence Classes across the community • Activation of open spaces across the City through a number of avenues, including Healthy Lifestyle classes, as well as providing grants and funding for community events such as Neighbour Day • Walking groups are available to reduce individual feelings of safety. EOI available to start one in your area • Currently investigating communities understanding and experience of disorderly behaviour to possibly provide new initiatives to support community • Carry out an awareness campaign for community on reporting to Police
Drug Dealing	3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police • CPTED Approach – Street lighting across the City has been improved to improve visibility of the streets. 465 out of 538 lights have been updated – 86% • Street by Street – a neighbourhood engagement initiative that brings residents together to educate and strengthen local connections, build community pride and encourage reporting to Police • Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours • Mobile CCTV Trailers to hotspot locations
Home Burglary	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) • CCTV Subsidy • Street Meets – build a connection with neighbours
Hoon Driving	5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police • Community reporting allows the City to target hotspots and direct the traffic team to investigate using traffic counters to collect data • Strategic Planning with Main Roads • Regular community catch up opportunities with local police to hear community concerns • \$197,000 grant awarded to the City to secure MORVA, (Medina Off Road Vehicle Area) including a single entry point via Thomas Road and installation of CCTV towers to monitor the area
Shoplifting	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working in collaboration with local businesses and Police in relation to reporting crime • Roll out of Keeping Kids in School Campaign – a Police initiative working in collaboration with Local Schools to increase attendance and decrease shoplifting and antisocial behaviour at local businesses
Robbery (Stealing with threats of violence or actual violence)	7	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police
Assault	8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Investigating personal safety devices • CPTED Approach – Street lighting across the City has been improved to improve visibility of streets. 465 out of 538 lights have been updated – 86% • Walking groups are available to reduce individual feelings of safety. EOI available to start one in your area • Campaign on reporting to police – crime stoppers / eyes on the street • Public CCTV • The Zone is a safe space (Town Centre) • Trial Kickboxing / Self Defence Classes across the community
