	Priority	Initiatives/Actions to address concern
Careless and / or Dangerous Driving	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Deploy traffic counters to monitor vehicle speeds in response to complaints on specific sections of local roads, with a focus on Lyon Road and Honeywood Avenue • Share traffic data with WA Police for enforcement purposes at Lyon Road, Honeywood Avenue, and other locations as requested • Install a new children's crossing on Honeywood Avenue near Honeywood Primary School and assess additional locations as required • Rearrange the school parking layout to improve "kiss and ride" functionality in collaboration with Honeywood Primary School • Assess and prune roadside vegetation where it restricts sight distance and contributes to road safety concerns, typically in response to customer requests (City Operations) • Install raised safety platforms at intersections along the southern section of Lyon Road as part of new developments and reduce the speed limit from 60 km/h to 50 km/h • Progress the planning and design of a major road upgrade on Anketell Road, including the Lyon Road intersection • Continue coordination with the City of Cockburn regarding improvements to Rowley Road intersections with Lyon Road and De Haer Road • Undertake line marking improvements along Lyon Road • Ongoing infrastructure maintenance (footpath repairs, bollards)

Hoon Driving	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working in collaboration with Police and community to encourage reporting to allow targeted responses from Police • Community reporting allows the City to target hotspots and direct the traffic team to investigate using traffic counters to collect data • Strategic Planning with Main Roads • Regular community catch up opportunities with local police to hear community concerns • \$197,000 grant awarded to the City to secure MORVA, (Medina Off Road Vehicle Area) including a single entry point via Thomas Road and installation of CCTV towers to monitor the area
