### Welcome to Kwinana

#### Kwinana is a thriving metropolitan City with an intimate, country feel – an escape from the hustle and bustle of Perth City life, yet less than 30 minutes away by train.

The City of Kwinana is home to around 42,000 residents over an area of 118km<sup>2</sup>, which includes the suburbs and localities of Anketell, Bertram, Calista, Casuarina, Hope Valley, Kwinana Beach, Kwinana Town Centre, Leda, Mandogalup, Medina, Naval Base, Orelia, Parmelia, Postans, The Spectacles, Wandi and Wellard.

Kwinana takes its name from the ship SS Kwinana, which was wrecked on Cockburn Sound in 1922. Kwinana is a Kimberly Aboriginal word meaning 'pretty maiden'. Some suburbs of Kwinana are also named after ships that first brought immigrants to Western Australia including Medina, Calista and Parmelia.

Kwinana industry continues to be a major contributor to the success of Western Australia at a national and international level. The Kwinana Industrial Area is one of the most affluent areas of employment in the state, generating 26,000 jobs and over \$15billion into the economy each year. Kwinana is amongst the most culturally and linguistically diverse areas in the Perth metropolitan region. Kwinana is a place where everyone belongs, with the City proudly welcoming new citizens through monthly Citizenship Ceremonies.

A network of public transport, including two train stations, means Kwinana is easily accessible to those outside the area and is the ideal location for workers who need to commute to the CBD.

#### **KWINANA PUBLIC LIBRARY**

The Kwinana Public Library is located within the Darius Wells Library and Resource Centre, in Kwinana's City Centre. Library membership is free and offers access to a range of items to borrow — including books, DVDs, audiobooks, puzzles, children's books and more.

#### **ZONE YOUTH SPACE**

The Zone is a purpose-built youth space catering for young people in Kwinana between the ages of 12 and 24 years. The facility offers a large range of youth-oriented programs, workshops, events and activities.

Featuring a multipurpose sports stadium, multimedia facilities, an art area and music rehearsal and performance spaces, the Zone is a youth friendly, safe place where young people can develop new skills, enhance existing abilities and socialise with peers.

#### **COMMUNITY CENTRES**

The City's Community Centres are home to a range of creative, educational and social programs – many either low cost or free. Each centre has a range of rooms and function spaces available to hire for your next meeting or event. Term programs are available at each centre or online at our website.

#### **PARKS AND OVALS**

Kwinana is fortunate to have a variety of green open spaces and parks ranging in size, purpose and amenities. Surrounded by bushland, open spaces and wetlands, Kwinana is a great place to explore on foot or bicycle.

## Registering your Pet

Animal registrations are transferable between Local Governments within Western Australia. There is no charge to transfer a current (paid, in date) registration. Please come in and see our Customer Service team and provide proof of registration and fill out a registration form.

The *Dog Act 1976* requires that all dogs over the age of three months are registered and that a maximum of two dogs are kept on any one premise.

The *Cat Act 2011* requires all cats that have reached six months of age must be microchipped, sterilised and registered with the Local Government.

Registrations fees can be paid at the City of Kwinana Administration Building. Payments can also be made via post and fax, please see our website or phone our Customer Service team on **9439 0200**.

Documents must be provided to prove sterilisation and micro-chipping. Discounts are available to pensioners.

## Other Services

#### **EMERGENCY PREPARATION AND RESPONSE**

#### WASTE AND RECYCLING

The City of Kwinana provides residents with one 240 litre General Waste Bin (green lid), emptied weekly. Contents of this bin are taken to landfill. Residents also receive **one 240 litre** or **360 litre Recycle Bin** (yellow lid), emptied fortnightly. The City encourages recycling of plastic (no soft plastics), aluminium cans (no aerosol cans), steel containers, paper, cardboard and glass.

The City also provides the following verge collections for bulk waste that does not fit into the bin – **four** green waste collections per year; and **two** bulk waste collections per year.
