Game changing project for Thomas Oval

A \$3.2 million changeroom and kiosk facility on Thomas Oval will be ready for early next year, catering for rugby and archery clubs along with the wider community.

The project's cost is partly funded by a \$2.4 million federal *Investing in Our Communities* grant committed at the last election by Brand MHR Madeleine King. The remaining \$800,000 is being funded through developer contributions.

Mayor Peter Feasey said the changeroom facility would be built on the other side of the oval to the Thomas Kelly Pavilion to cater for the Kwinana Titans and AIM Archery clubs who walk

several hundred metres to access changerooms at the pavilion.

"The new facility will include four changerooms, two storage areas, two universally accessible toilets, two dedicated umpires rooms, covered spectators areas, two storage areas and a kiosk," Mayor Feasey said.

"As part of this project, funding will also be used to refurbish the kitchen in the existing Thomas Hall building.

"Practical completion is expected to take place in December 2025 with an official opening and community celebration planned for early 2026.

"This project delivers new sporting infrastructure which is critical to support participation and the physical and social wellbeing of residents in our community.

"This is an investment in the local clubs' growth and ongoing success," he said.

Big changes to your bins

Moving towards a greener future

This year, the City of Kwinana is introducing exciting changes to make waste management smarter, cleaner, and more sustainable.

Over the coming months the City will be updating its bin collection zones, introducing a new three bin Garden Organics (GO) system and moving to a pre-booked verge collection service.

From 31 March 2025, collection zones are being updated to improve efficiency and align with your suburb boarders. Your collection day and recycling week might change – check the map to ensure you are good to GO.

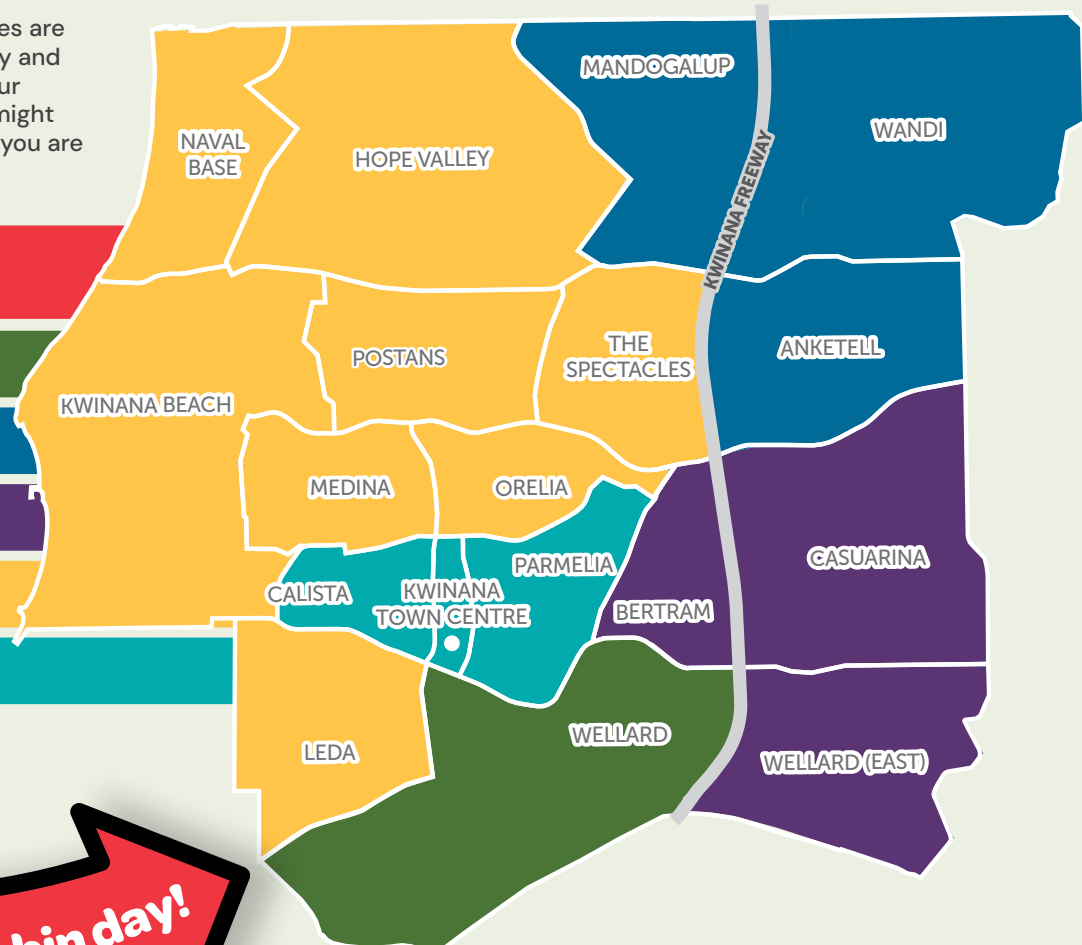

Your GO Bin. Sorted. ✓

The City is rolling out its new three bin system from late April 2025, making it easier than ever to recycle garden waste. With a lime green-lidded Garden Organics (GO) bin, residents can dispose of garden waste sustainably and efficiently.

Who gets a GO Bin?

If your property is over 350m², you'll automatically receive a GO bin as part of the rollout. If your property is under 350m² you can opt-in to receive a GO bin at any time. Residents who live in an apartment or multi-unit dwelling with shared bin arrangements will be assessed on a case-by-case basis after the rollout.

New bin sizes and collection

As part of the transition, the City is introducing standard bin sizes to align with best practice waste management:

- ➔ Red Lid: 140L General Waste
- ➔ Yellow Lid: 360L or 240L Recycling
- ➔ Lime Green Lid: 240L Garden Organics

If you need more space, residents can also request a free upgrade to a bigger 360L recycling bin.

What goes in the GO Bin?

- **What goes in?** Leaves, grass clippings, small branches, and other garden waste.
- **What stays out?** Plastic bags, food waste, and treated timber.

When will it be collected?

The GO bin will be collected fortnightly, on the opposite week to your recycling bin.

The City is introducing a pre-booked verge collection service for bulky waste starting in July 2025. Bookings can be made online or by contacting the City's contractor from June 2025.

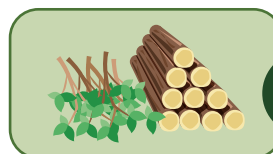

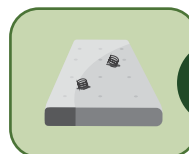

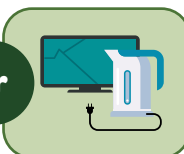

This initiative aims to provide greater convenience, promote environmental sustainability, and enhance waste management efficiency within the community.

Trio of waterers keep the birds cool

Did you know that the City of Kwinana actively supports endangered Carnaby's Black Cockatoo populations?

Two new bird waterers were installed in Wellard and Parmelia in November to provide bird populations with fresh water for bathing and drinking through the warmer months.

The bird waterers were installed in conjunction with Murdoch University's Keep Carnaby's Flying – Ngoolarks Forever Project, funded by Lotterywest, which included mature banksia plantings earlier in the year as food sources for Carnaby's.

The City of Kwinana was selected to participate in the project for the second round between 2023 and 2024,



as it was identified as an important foraging and roosting spot in the metropolitan area.

These 3m-tall additions complement the existing bird waterer installed on

Council Green out the front of the City's Administration Building in 2021.

Two more bird waterers will be added, one in Wellard this year and one in Wandi next year.

Quenda signs at Wells Park encourage conservation

The City of Kwinana, in partnership with Perth NRM and Alcoa, installed a new sign at Wells Park to raise awareness about the quenda (Southwestern Brown Bandicoot) and local conservation efforts.

As ecosystem engineers, quendas dig and forage, turning over soil, dispersing seeds, and improving water filtration.

But populations have declined due to habitat loss, vehicle strikes, and predators like foxes and feral cats.

To counter this, efforts included the Challenger Beach Coastal Rehabilitation Project with more than 40,000 native seedlings plants and quenda shelters installed.

Wildlife cameras recorded an increase in quenda sightings, showing the positive impact of conservation work.

Visitors can help protect quenda by:

- Not feeding them – Their natural diet keeps them healthy.
- Driving slowly – Quenda are most active at dawn and dusk.
- Keeping cats indoors – Cats are a major threat to quenda.
- Respecting habitat areas – Stay off dunes and dispose of litter properly.

The City of Kwinana, Perth NRM, and Alcoa remain committed to protecting local biodiversity. To support quenda conservation at home, visit rewildperth.com.au.



Communications board

The Kwinana Adventure Park has a new communications board!

This board provides an alternative for park users who may not speak verbally, and it can be used to help clarify speech and support verbal communication.

The board features a grid of symbols and words that allow people to express thoughts, needs and ideas by pointing to the symbols or using gestures.

During the design process with Two Way Street, the City consulted with the Ngala peer support and inclusion group at the Child and Parent Centre Calista, and the City of Kwinana's Access and Inclusion Reference Group to ensure this addition makes the Adventure Park an even more inclusive space for visitors!



New devices put bush fire brigades on the map

The City of Kwinana provided six tablets to two bush fire brigades to better equip frontline firefighting appliances.

The tablets were installed in the Urban Tankers and Light Tankers at the Mandogalup Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade and the Kwinana South Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade.

Mayor Peter Feasey said the tablets provided fast access to up-to-date and interactive digital maps allowing for faster fire mapping.

"Crews can now map a fire ahead of any air intel and upload it into the map," Mayor Feasey said.

"This allows for improved safety on the fire ground for brigade members, and enhances their responsiveness to fires," he said.

The Samsung Galaxy Tablet Active 5 5G are rated to military standard specifications, designed to operate in extreme conditions.

The fire ground mapping application known as Firemapper can be used by City of Kwinana volunteer crews in their local area, adjoining Local Government areas, and across Western Australia in the event of deployment.

Approved applications, mounts and cradles were covered through the Local Government Grant Scheme which is sourced from the Emergency Services Levy collected to maintain the brigades.

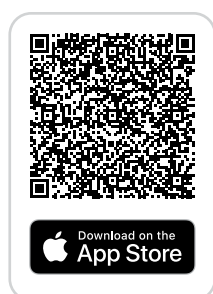
Crews can now map a fire ahead of any air intel and upload it into the map.

Kwinana South received their devices and Firemapper training in January, with Mandogalup scheduled for training in February.

Dambart Karlak celebrates Kwinana's identity



This contemporary artwork highlights the deep Nyoongar connection to place while expressing Kwinana's rich heritage and community spirit.

The City of Kwinana is proud to introduce *Dambart Karlak*, a stunning new artwork by Noongar and Saibai Islander artist Tyrown Waigana.

The title translates to *Dambart* meaning "three" and *Karlak* meaning "home" or "camp," reflecting both Nyoongar culture and Kwinana's identity.

The design features boomerangs as symbols of Kwinana being a place that

Nyoongar people always return to. So, too the bobtails return to each other like the Nyoongar people return to Kwinana. The shields were chosen as they are representative of safety and protection.

The marking on the shields and the core of the graphic present icons for what the City of Kwinana is known for which is the proximity to the ocean, industrial heritage and an abundance of trees.

The background artwork, *Boola Dilbi* (Many Living Leaves), represents abundance, growth, and the living presence of Nyoongar culture in Kwinana. The stone elements symbolise Kwinana's 17 suburbs, and figures representing cultural diversity further enrich the piece.

This contemporary artwork highlights the deep Nyoongar connection to place while expressing Kwinana's rich heritage and community spirit.

Coogee Chemicals artworks

If you've driven along Patterson Road in Kwinana Beach recently, you may have noticed a striking new feature – a series of artworks projected onto one of Coogee Chemicals' newly built fuel storage tanks.

Under the City of Kwinana's Local Planning Policy, developments of this scale must incorporate public artwork. From the outset, Coogee Chemicals envisioned integrating art into their redevelopment through projections, a vision brought to life through collaboration with the City of Kwinana and Public Art Consultants UDLA. Embracing the central theme: "The Heart of Industry," the artwork honours Kwinana's industrial heritage while celebrating creativity and innovation.

A call for submissions went out to the art community locally, nationally, and internationally, inviting ideas for this unique opportunity. The response was

overwhelming, with more than 50 submissions received from Australia and countries like the United States, Indonesia, and Mexico. The process also highlighted local talent from Kwinana and Rockingham.

After a rigorous selection process, six artists were chosen to create a series of five pieces each. Jane Coffey, Carla Gottgens, Brendan (Hope) Lewis, Andrew HC McDonald, Roly Skender, and Wade Taylor brought diverse perspectives and styles, transforming industrial infrastructure into a canvas for storytelling and beauty.

Kwinana-based artist Brendan (Hope) Lewis' commission for this project included large-scale portraits of significant industry-related figures, paying homage to the community's industrial and social history. Two of these original works have been temporarily installed at the William Bertram Community Centre. Brendan



further expanded on this concept with a stunning mural at the Kwinana Marketplace, incorporating portraits of community members from all walks of the industry.

The mural, and all of the artist's work projected at Patterson Road, are a testament to the power of collaboration between industry, government, and the arts community. It not only adds vibrancy to the area but also sparks conversations about the connection between industry and culture, creating a unique identity for Kwinana.

Next time you're in the area, take a moment to appreciate these remarkable works of art. They're more than just projections on tanks; they're reflections of our community's heart, history, and creativity.



Koorliny Arts Centre received 10 awards for two in-house theatre productions, including Best Musical Production for *Come From Away* and Best Play Production for *Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors*.

Just five talented cast members created a fast-paced production that had audiences roaring with laughter.

Mayor Feasey said it was a must-see comedy set in a quirky, spooky version of Transylvania that captivated local theatregoers, blending the supernatural with slapstick humour.

"These awards reflect Koorliny's standing in the theatre community, producing incredibly powerful

performances that unite and move audiences," he said.

Koorliny Arts Centre coordinator Emma Del Pino said the centre was proud to present such high-quality productions that truly bring the community together and attract audiences from across the regions.

"It is such an honour to receive these awards from the Independent Theatre Association of WA and I praise the hard work, dedication and volunteer time of the cast and crew to deliver award-winning community theatre performances with such powerful storytelling and a desire to engage," Mrs Del Pino said.

Singing Mamas in Wellard

The City of Kwinana has partnered with Singing Mamas to launch free singing sessions in Wellard to support women's mental health.

Run by Nicole George, the group is designed to support women residing in the City of Kwinana.

"In 2023, I came across a shocking statistic: suicide is the leading cause of death for pregnant individuals and parents of children under one year old," she said.

"This alarming fact inspired me to research and connect with a well-established organisation in the UK called Singing Mamas Org.

"A study published in the British Journal of Psychiatry highlighted

that group singing significantly reduces symptoms of postnatal depression.

"The findings revealed that 73 per cent of participants in a 10-week program reported recovery, along with increased self-esteem and bonding with their children," she said.

Determined to bring this positive initiative to Western Australia, Nicole trained as a certified Singing Mamas leader and launched her first group in Byford earlier this year.

"In 2025, I am thrilled to announce that I will be partnering with the City of Kwinana to offer Singing Mamas sessions in Wellard, completely free of charge," she said.

"These sessions will take place every Wednesday morning from 10.30am to 12pm in the Hovea Room at the John Wellard Community Centre.

"While children are welcome, the primary focus will be on supporting women in a nourishing and inclusive environment.

"Our sessions will continue year-round, even during school holidays - no musical experience is needed and while there is a focus on post-partum women, women of all ages and stages of life are welcome to join."
