You may have recently participated in the 'Love My Kwinana Strategic Community Plan' (SCP) consultation process. This helped the City of Kwinana understand your vision for the community and your priorities across environmental, economic, social and governance areas.

To assist the City's SCP vision, we have a range of specific Strategies that provide more detailed guidance about where to focus our efforts. This is where the **Social Strategy** will sit. We have Action Plans that sit below the Social Strategy that specifically refer to the programs, infrastructure, services and policies that will be implemented to address those priorities. These carry through to our annual Budget and Corporate Business Plan, and most importantly flow through to City officer's Individual Work Plans, which, lead to actions that achieve your vision:



For example, the SCP might say you want us to focus on community safety. The Social Strategy would then address which aspects of community safety are most important to focus on.

In the past, the City has developed a range of specific Strategies and Plans that were developed somewhat in isolation. These included the Multicultural Action Plan, Youth Strategy, Public Health Plan, Crime Prevention and Community Safety Plan and more. The Social Strategy intends to roll together all the various strategies into one streamlined document.

The community was heavily engaged in developing each of those plans, so we have had a lot of past input which helped us developed a draft set of Social Strategy Priorities that appear to fall into five themes. These are listed below:



You will notice the statements do not say specifically what action we will take. Rather than guess at specific actions for four years ahead, we want to engage with you, our community, in a more meaningful way on an ongoing basis to develop and continuously update our Action Plans and ideally partner with you in those actions. We have included some examples of current actions the City takes in the tables below to give you some context as to what the priorities might look like as actions.

To reduce duplication and wordiness, the Strategic Priority statements also deliberately avoid specifying different demographics or groups. This would be detailed at the Action Plan stage. The Social Strategy will also include overarching information about the way we work such as working in partnership, using a place-based approach to tailoring actions, financial sustainability, service integration and more.

By having a say on the proposed Social Strategy priorities, you will help us deliver evidence-informed programs and services that meet the needs of our diverse community.
