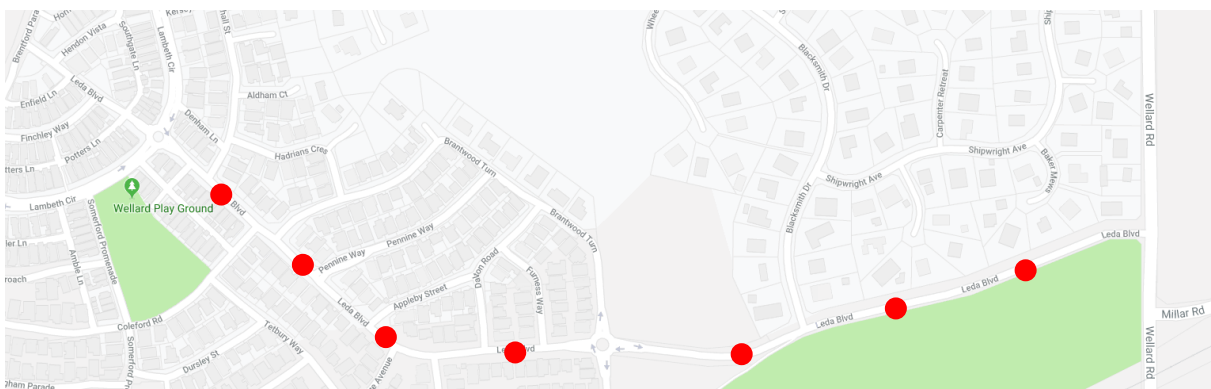
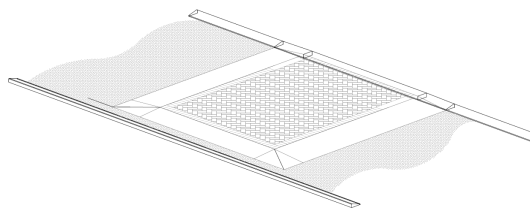

LEDA BOULEVARD PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING, WELLARD WA 6170

As part of the 2020/2021 Capital Budget preparation, the City of Kwinana is investigating into the possibility of implementing traffic calming devices along Leda Boulevard between Lambeth Circle and Wellard Road in Wellard. During the past several years, since Leda Boulevard extension was completed, connecting Wellard Road to Lambeth Circle, the City has received numerous complaints from local residents concerned about the speed of traffic. The City has investigated data that indicates Leda Boulevard will benefit from traffic calming to reduce traffic speeds, reduce the severity of accidents, improve road safety, improve safety for vulnerable road users and improve the liveability and amenity.

Before the traffic management design and plans are finalised, we would like to seek feedback and comments from local residents. The traffic management proposal is to construct a series of raised pavements at select locations yet to be confirmed, to maintain safe speeds along Leda Boulevard. Raised pavements are vertical displacement traffic calming devices with less severe vertical deflection. They consist of raised sections of roadway approximately 75 to 100mm high ramped up (grade 1:20) from the normal road level, and extend a minimum of 6m or more such as the examples below.
